At the end of Year 9, students will complete an unaided listening and appraising music assessment. Students will answer questions based on keywords and understanding developed throughout the entirety of Key Stage 3. These questions will feature a range of multiple choice answers and short written responses. This follows a similar format to what students will experience for Section A of AQA GCSE Music Component 1.
