How does this year deliver your curriculum intent?

At Key Stage 4, students will deepen their knowledge and understanding and further explore attitudes, values and attributes acquired during KS3. The curriculum reflects the fact that students are moving towards an independent role in adult life, taking on greater responsibility for themselves and others. There will also be a focus on Post-16 routes and careers as our students prepare to leave us.
