Dear Parent/Carer

Year 10 Geography Visit to Flamborough and Hornsea on Thursday 16 April 2026

We are delighted to confirm that your child has been allocated a place on the trip to Flamborough and Hornsea on **Thursday 16 April 2026** to support their grasp of some key ideas as well as providing experience of fieldwork activities; a requirement for the GCSE. This fieldwork experience will build towards the paper 3 examination.

Students are required to meet at the academy, with the intention to depart at 8:30 am, returning to the academy, at 4:30 pm; depending upon traffic. As the return time is after the end of the academy day, information regarding student dismissal will be taken from the consent form sent out last academic year.

Fieldwork experiences are an important part of the geography curriculum and allow students to experience geography beyond the classroom in a way that we cannot recreate within the academy; as such we require all students to attend. In order for the trip to go ahead, we are requesting a contribution of £16.90 towards the cost of the coach transport.

Payment should be made via the ParentPay facility. If you are unable to access to ParentPay and require a barcoded letter to pay at a PayPoint, please email admin@stwacademy.com and a letter will be printed for the student to collect from Reception. The deadline for payment is Thursday 26 March 2026. If you are facing financial hardship and are unable to make the payment, please contact admin@stwacademy.com and a member of staff will contact you to discuss options in which we may be able to offer support.

Please also note that giving consent and making payment, does not automatically guarantee the students participation in the visit. This is dependent on student behaviour, attendance and motivation.

Due to the nature of the location and potential changes in weather, students will not need to be in full school uniform, however, clothing worn should be smart, comfortable, and appropriate for the weather conditions forecast. Sensible shoes are also necessary due to slippery surfaces, sand and the amount of walking planned for the day (trainers/walking boots would be appropriate). It is advisable to have a change of footwear, plenty of water, a hat and sun protection for this visit. Students will also need a bag (school style bag will suffice), in which they can carry equipment, additional clothing and food if they wish.

As the location has a range of facilities, students can either bring a packed lunch or money to purchase food. If the student is in receipt of Free School Meals, a packed lunch will be provided.

Students will be supervised by members of academy staff during the visit and there will be a trained first aider present as part of this supervision. If there are occasions on this trip where students are casually supervised, students will be briefed ahead of the trip with the meeting points, times and details on how to contact a member of academy staff in the event of an emergency.
