Dear Parent/Carer

I hope that you all managed to have a lovely half term break and have managed to dodge the horrible weather brought by the recent storms. A member of the public was so taken by the mature approach of our students that she emailed us the below.

"As I walked along Petergate (York), I noticed large numbers of young people on some kind of field trip - all were behaving impeccably, then out of the blue, an elderly lady fell full length on the pavement. A number of your students immediately went to her aid, checking she was uninjured and offering nothing but kindness and sympathy. Once the lady felt she would be able to stand up, two students and a staff member ensured she could get to her feet by gently assisting her, and she was able to go on her way.

You should be proud of them, and they should be proud of themselves - they represented their school very well indeed."

Teaching and Learning

We have had a positive and invested start back in lessons across the Academy. Every lesson, students are expected to place their planner and pencil case on the desk to signal that they are prepared to learn. All lessons begin with a sharp start that students access as soon as they enter the classroom; the sharp start is often a recall task designed to support students to consolidate previous learning and recall any prior knowledge that may be useful to apply in the lesson. During these first few minutes of the lesson, teachers greet students at the door, take the register, and purposefully navigate around the room supporting students to complete their sharp start in a timely and successful manner. It is evident that this consistent approach in every classroom sets the tone for a productive and focused lesson in which students are supported to thrive from the moment the bell rings.

Events and Enrichment

GCSE Geography trip to York

Our Year 11 Geography students were a credit to the Academy during their GCSE fieldwork trip to York on Wednesday this week. All staff were impressed with the conduct of the students, especially with how they interacted with members of the public for one of their tasks. The students were fully invested in collecting data, taking photographs, and gaining the geographical knowledge and skills that they will need for their exam in the Summer.

BBC Bitesize Careers

On Wednesday this week, we hosted the very prestigious BBC to deliver a presentation on careers to Years 7-10. The presentation was hosted by Steve Forbes (Talk Sport presenter) who interviewed three professionals in a 'panel-style' setup. The panel were made up of a TV researcher, a presenter, and an illustrator for children's books. Each professional was interviewed about their career and career path. They covered a variety of topics, such as relevant qualifications, personal anecdotes, advice on work experience and key skills for the workplace.

The students then had the opportunity to ask questions and the whole aim was to help inspire young minds about opportunities that exist and raise awareness of career aspirations with practical advice on how students can pursue a career in a variety of settings. This was an exciting event which created great memories and generated ideas for our students.

Free theatre trip for all Year 10 students

The English department would like to remind parents of Year 10 students about the trip to CAST theatre in Doncaster to watch a professional production of A Christmas Carol, the novella by Charles Dickens that they are studying for their GCSE.
