What are the assessments about?

Well, they help us gain a rounded view of how well your young person is doing and where they can develop further with our help.

What will the report show?

Revision Hacks:

Satchel One/SparksMaths:

Homework is a great place to start your revision journey, it gives you independent tasks that consolidate your learning in lessons. Practice makes perfect and supports locking the valuable learning in your long-term memory ready for those exams!

Tassomai:

Tassomai is an adaptive learning program supporting GCSE English, Science, Geography, History and Computer Science.

Tassomai's multiple choice micro-quizzes reinforce knowledge through targeted repetition, like a flashcard. The quizzes are supported by short explainer videos and curated links to relevant external resources.

At the same time the algorithm is learning each student's strengths and weaknesses; it uses this information to target the gaps in a student's knowledge and provide feedback to teachers on which areas individuals and entire classes need help with.

I can't emphasize how good this app is, I wish we had these opportunities when I studied for GCSE. It would have made my revision so much more enjoyable and effective.
